Academic Skills Seminars

Alice Mattoni and Manuela Moschella

Course Overview

This course aims to equip graduate students with essential skills for academic and professional development. Through interactive seminars, students will gain practical insights into crafting effective CVs and motivation letters, publishing academic articles and books, applying for grants, exploring career opportunities outside academia, and preparing for job interviews.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, students will:

- 1. Develop a professional CV and motivation letter that effectively highlight their academic achievements and career goals.
- 2. Understand the publication process for academic articles and books, including how to approach editors and reviewers.
- 3. Gain insights into applying for competitive research grants, with a particular focus on Marie Curie and ERC Starting grants.
- 4. Network and engage with journal editors to understand their expectations and best practices for publication.
- 5. Explore career options outside academia and understand the skills and qualifications needed for these roles.
- 6. Prepare for job interviews in both academic and non-academic settings.

Course Structure

• **Session Format**: Each session will include a presentation by the instructor followed by interactive discussions and activities. Some sessions will also include guest speakers.

- Assignments: Students will complete short assignments to prepare a CV, draft a motivation letter, and explore career options. Feedback will be provided to support skill development.
- **Final Assessment**: A mock job interview will serve as the final assessment, allowing students to practice interview techniques and receive feedback.

The final assessment will be a mock interview, where students will apply the skills developed in the course. They will receive detailed feedback on their performance, including areas for improvement and suggestions for further preparation.
